




Celebrating Difference!



Our new jigsaw topic this term is all about "celebrating difference." This week, Compassion Class thought about their own cultures and discussed their values and

beliefs. The children also discussed what racism is and they all designed a ribbon to encourage everyone to treat each other fairly. Finally, Compassion Class thought about the different types of bullying and thought about the difference between "direct" and "indirect" types of bullying. The children discussed how they could help a girl called Carol who was being bullied.



Scenario: "Carol has recently moved to the school. She has few friends and recently a group of girls has made it obvious they will not accept her into their group, by isolating her and giving her nasty looks. They make her feel like they are talking about her and she has recently begun to receive anonymous text messages calling her names. Carol feels very lonely, sad and isolated and is feeling scared about coming to school."

- talk to her


Something that might make the situation worse.







Dodos Are Not Extinct

The bird in this book has a big secret to tell - they are in fact not a bird at all, rather a dodo in disguise! But dodos are extinct, aren't they? This dodo is here to prove otherwise

The trouble with being rare and close to extinction is that you get a lot of unwanted attention. So, whether it's strapping on a

beak to look like a bird or suiting up in a tuxedo to fit in with the penguins, dodos have found a way to go about unnoticed. Dodos aren't the only masters of disguise. A whole cast of famous 'extinct' animals - from the woolly mammoth to the sabre-toothed tiger - have found inventive ways to blend into their surroundings and fool us all!

This brilliant, playful picture book is packed full of silly humour as well as informative content about famous extinct creatures. The final pages are a lovely and useful addition to the book dispelling fact from fiction & there are brief information snippets on various extinct creatures that feature in the story, some which have gone extinct naturally and some which humans have caused.

Young readers can delight in the spotting what extinct animals lie beneath the funny disguises depicted in the vibrant and expressive illustrations. We particularly love the expression of the grumpy sabre-toothed tiger!
