In Joy Class this week, the children have been learning about how toys have changed since their older relatives were little. This week, the children became detectives and looked at toys from the past and present.


In small groups, Joy Class inspected the toys and decided if they were old or new. The children really enjoyed playing with toys from the past and looking at similarities and differences.

<u>Six Year Old Climbs Height</u> of Everest for Children's Hospice

A six-year-old boy has captivated the world with his attempt to climb 12 peaks, the equivalent height of Mount Everest to raise money for a Children's Hospice in Chorley. He has been featured on more than 136 different newspapers, news websites and TV reports around the world!

He set himself a target of £29,030 (matching the height of Everest) to enable 'poorly children to go on holiday'. So far, he has gone on to raise more than £30,000 for the hospice and has been named as a UK Point of Light winner in August!

<u>Rare Friezes found in</u> <u>400-year-old flat</u>


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Kitchen fitters in a flat in York have uncovered friezes, believed to be around 400 years old. It is believed the paintings date back to 1660 and are thought to be older than the buildings on either side of the wall. They are based on scenes from a 1635 book called Emblems by poet Francis Quarles.

A "very excited" flat owner, Luke said "I got my tools out and started chipping away at the board. As soon as I lifted the panel off, there it was, beautiful colours, with some still remaining layers of wallpaper from the Victorian era".

Luke is hoping to secure funding for conservation work on the paintings.

Monster In The Woods

Is there a monster in the woods? That's what everyone's saying; cows are disappearing and crops being destroyed so there's definitely *something* weird going on. But a monster? Really?

Frith, for one, isn't at all sure but she's determined to find out s if only because her little brother Spuggy is worried about his imaginary friend, Edward, who also lives in the woods and might be in danger.

And so begins a very strange journey of discovery in which Frith takes advice from a Big Wise Head in the Barren Wasteland, meets the king, and eats far too much turnip and cabbage soup. But what she finds is more surprising than anyone could have expected.

Set in a non-specific historical era that looks a bit like the Middle Ages, Frith's search for a monster is brilliantly funny and gloriously rambling with a great twist at the end.

Accessible to younger readers, but with a plot and writing that will be enjoyed across Key Stage 2, this is a story with broad appeal and a subtle message about not judging by appearances.

With entertaining and evocative black and white illustrations throughout, *Monster in the Woods* is light-hearted, fun and a cracking read
