Stone Age Cave Paintings

Hope Class talked about why cave art is so important to historians for finding out information from this period of history. They also had fun recreating their own Stone Age artwork at Forest school. The children experimented with using natural dyes such as grass, mud, charcoal and beetroot to create different colours.
















St. Mary's Visit To Royal Cornwall Museum

This week, our Hope, Compassion and Courage Classes all ventured out to the Royal Cornwall Museum as part of their topics 'Stone Age to Iron Age', 'The Greeks' and 'Egypt'.

Hope Class - 'Stone Age to Iron Age'

The children met with Michael and Lottie, their fantastic guides who, in their groups learned how to make clay coil pots and embarked on a tour of the exhibits. During their tour, the children were able to handle artifacts that were around over 400,000 years ago! They also saw various tools which demonstrated how people utilised the environment in their day to day life. Hope Class were so inspired by this trip that when they returned to school, some even said they wanted to become architects!

Compassion Class - "Ancient Greece"

During Compassion Class's visit to the museum, they enjoyed a workshop all about Ancient Greece. They split into groups to take part in two activities which involved handling and drawing pots and working with clay to make a tile of a Greek pot. The children found it fascinating to handle pots that were thousands of years old and to see the different designs and shapes. The children really enjoying being able to explore the primary sources up close.

Courage Class - "Ancient Egypt"

Courage Class were the final explorers this week and headed down to the museum to take part in their Egyptian workshop led by Mike and Lottie. Throughout the session, the children learned and discussed the mummification process and the Ancient Egyptian beliefs about the journey to the afterlife. Following this, the children had the opportunity to explore and handle the Ancient Egyptian artifacts and even got to see the mummy of Iset Tayef Nakht

Each class had a fantastic time and we are so proud of how well you engaged with the activities and represented St. Mary's.



Determined to prove his worth, Leif embarks on a secret mission to locate a missing shard from Thor's hammer, which has landed far away in polar bear territory. Thorbjorg the

Witch provides him with a map of the route and a magic cloak. The hapless pup sets off on his quest, accompanied by fellow adventurers Olaf the duck, Toki the puffin and Flora the stinky musk ox. As they attempt to navigate across vast, dangerous lands, they must contend with hungry giants, fearsome polar bears and a sea beast as old as the gods themselves.

This hilarious Viking adventure has oodles of laughs on every page. The dynamic black-and-white illustrations are full of humour and there is a fun board game to play in the middle of the story. An informative glossary and some interesting Viking facts can be found at the end of the book.
