Level 1 Bikeability

In Level 1, the children learned key cycling techniques in a safe, traffic-free environment. They practiced essential skills such as starting and stopping safely, balancing, pedalling, and using their gears effectively. The children also worked on their bike control by learning to make turns, signal, and navigate obstacles with ease.

It was wonderful to see their determination, teamwork, and enthusiasm throughout the sessions. Whether they were already confident on two wheels or just starting out, each child made fantastic progress, and by the end of the training, they were riding with greater control and assurance.


