
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Looking After the World

Exploring Watercolour Techniques



This week, Compassion Class immersed themselves in the world of watercolour painting as part of their art exploration. The children had the opportunity to experiment with various watercolour techniques before creating their own stunning cityscape reflections, viewed through bottles of water.


They began by learning how to create different washes, including a flat wash, where they carefully applied an even layer of colour across their paper, and a graded wash, which allowed them to produce a beautiful gradient of colour that fades

smoothly. The spray technique was a big hit, with the children using water and brushes to create interesting, unpredictable textures, while the sponge wash added a fun, tactile element to the process.

The children also explored colour lifting, a method used to remove pigment and create highlights or corrections, and they practised edge softening, blending the edges of the paint to give a softer, more natural look to their reflections.

Their focus was on capturing the reflections of buildings and lights in water, and the results were incredible. The
