Planting Seeds

Joy class have been looking at the skills required to write a successful set of instructions. The children looked at the type of information that needs to be given, the best format to use and strategies (including expanded noun phrases, time adverbials, imperative verbs and adverbs of manner) to improve their writing, providing greater detail and interest for the reader.

Working collaboratively as a class, Joy Class proposed their set of instructions to plants seeds which will hopefully with time and care, grow into sunflowers, peas and tomatoes to decorate their outside play and learning area. Once completed, the children then applied the skills they have been learning to edit and make their writing even better. Finally, Joy Class got to follow the instructions to ensure they were successful.



Bursting with quirky characters and imaginative world-building elements, this is the start of a delightful young fiction series. 

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
