They used straws and masking tape to carefully construct the frames, following the designs they had created earlier using computer-aided design software. It was incredible to see their digital ideas come to life as 3D structures.

While building the lanterns, the children thought carefully about how to strengthen any weaker areas of their designs. This process required teamwork, problem-solving, and a great deal of perseverance. The shell structures are now complete and ready for the next exciting step: covering them with tissue paper to make them look aesthetically pleasing as festive Christmas lanterns.
