Art Club with Miss Vowles

This week in Miss Vowles' Art Club, the children have been exploring the wonderful world of watercolours! They've been learning new techniques and experimenting with how water affects the shades and tones of the colours they use.

The focus of this week's session was understanding how the amount of water added to the paint can change the shade and darkness of the colour. By adding more water, they discovered how to make lighter, more delicate shades, and by using less water, they were able to create bolder, darker colours.



After practicing these techniques, the children applied what they had learned to create their own beautiful watercolour artwork. It was wonderful to see them experiment with colours and shading in new and creative ways.


Please collect your child at the usual time of 3.20pm.





We have had a number of reports of unsafe situations on the road outside school and as such, we would like to encourage our parents and carers to adopt the unofficial one way system, when dropping off and collecting children from school.

This would mean that drivers would come in to the turning for Higher Trehaverne, drive along the road and exit via Chainwalk Drive. If you follow this road around, it will take you back out onto Kenwyn Road. This can help to ensure there is a steady and safe stream of traffic outside our school.



We urge drivers to be aware of children walking along pavements and be mindful of this when manoeuvring their vehicles. We ask that drivers avoid mounting pavements and to also be aware of children crossing.

It is for the safety of pedestrians and road users that the law states 'No Parking' on zig-zag lines.

Please could we also request that road users do not use the entrance to the car park to turn around.

Please follow the above route and exit via Chainwalk Drive.

Please help us to keep the area outside school as safe as we can by driving and parking responsibly.


